ADP's database is part of their recycled parts locating network, EDEN®

The two-way interface will create a cross platform of data which will include advantages to the individual auto recycling facility, the insurance industry, the collision repair industry and both companies involved. The most immediate and direct benefit of the interface will involve the auto recycling industry. Phase one of the development will allow users of the either database (URGNet or EDEN) to view the parts of those recyclers that who do not currently trade on the same inventory management system. EDEN users can request to view the parts of URGNet on their inventory system and Pinnacle users can request that EDEN users' data become a part of their URGNet system as a local exchange.

Phase one of the integration will also allow URGNet users to participate in the same programs that ADP currently offers its other EDEN users, such as displaying their data on ADP's insurance estimating product, Parts Exchange Salvage (PXS). The positive effects of this go beyond the auto recycling industry. Insurance estimators will now be able to view this submitted recycled parts data and the collision repairers will be able to view the parts of URGNet participants using the PXS product. The PXS product used in conjunction with ADP's Shoplink® and PenPro® estimating products.

Phase two of the integration will include a more advanced search option for the users of URGNet. Beyond the local exchange functionality of phase one, phase two will allow Pinnacle/URGNet users to search the entire EDEN database with just a few keystrokes.

“The ability for Pinnacle users to access EDEN, particularly for the exchange partner facility, is terrific news for users who want to intertrade with local yards that are not on Pinnacle. We support non-proprietary cross platform sharing of information and look forward to completing the locates functionality.
